## ench Timeline at le Détroit (the Strait)

DETROIT	Etienne Brulé arrives at the Strait
1620 Spring	French trading post established at the Strait
1620 Fall	Mayflower arrives at Plymouth Rock
1640-41	Jean de Brébeuf and Chaumonot pass through the Strait, erect a large cross and pronounce, "Here is a land for all peoples."
1679	La Salle & Hennepin pass the Strait aboard le Griffon
1701	Cadillac founds "le Fort Pontchartrain du Détroit du Lac Erié"
1760	British take possession of the New France
1796	US/UK draw a border "le détroit"=> Detroit + Windsor
1805	The Great Fire of Detroit
1837	Michigan becomes a state.
1845	Construction of the current church of de l'Assumption - Windsor




## Antoine de la Mothe de Cadillac

- Living at Mackinac 1694-96, Cadillac befriended the local Indian Nations, the Hurons, Odawas and Potowotomis, that had been displaced from the Strait around 1640.
- In 1701 Cadillac founded Detroit with Nations from the north for a multiethnic, mutually-beneficial commercial enterprise for fur trade













## Waves of French to Michigan

10,000 French immigrants to New France 1609-1760










## Fort Pontchartrain du Detroit 1701





# The French-speaking Community of the Windsor Area

- •Growing Francophone population: 10,000+students 18 grade + 4 high schools
- Le Collège Boréal (one campus of province-wide community college)
- Francophone Community Center (CCF-WECK)
- French speaking African associations from the Congo, Rwanda, Burundi,
   Ivory Coast, Cameroun, Sénégal fur burdgeoning immigrant segment
- Résidence Richelieu (51 appartements for French seniors)
- Club Richelieu (social charitable organization functioning only in French)
- Churches: St Jérôme- Windsor, Ste Anne-Tecumseh, St Joseph-Riviere Canard

## Gabriel Richard – French Refugee in Detroit 1798-1832

- Co-founder of University of Michigan
- First printing press, first newspaper in MI
- First priest elected delegate to Congress
- Pastor of Ste Anne de Detroit
- Served also as minister to non-Catholics
- Opened Schools for Natives
- Died caring for victims of cholera epidemic
- Detroit Motto still used today: "We hope for better things, It will rise from the ashes" after 1805 fire
- Two area high schools and park across from Belle
   Isle named from Gabriel Richard

## The French legacy at the Strait today

- L'Alliance Française de Grosse Point (language and culture)
- Cadillac statue and plaques at Hart Plaza
- Statues at Wayne State- Marquette, La Salle, Cadillac, Gabriel Richard
- Le Rendez-vous du Detroit Annual French/Native cultural event
- CANADIAN SIDE of the RIVER: 15000 French speakers .....





#### **Promotion and Preservation Efforts**



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
